



When the rising waters toss me like a ship upon the sea, You who rule the wind and water, Lord, stand by me.

This image was inspired by a story in the 4th chapter of Mark's gospel. Jesus and the disciples are in a boat on the Sea of Galilee taking a break from the preaching and healing we will hear about today. The disciples wake Jesus when they are frightened by a storm that threatens to capsize the boat. Jesus rebukes the wind and tells the waves to be still. (He also chides the disciples for their lack of faith.)

The story of Jesus calming the waters inspired the hymn "Stand By Me" written by Charles Tindley. Tindley was born the son of a slave in 1906. Although he never went to school, he learned how to read and write by asking people to teach him. Tindley went from working as an unpaid janitor at the East Calvary Methodist Episcopal Church to being it's most successful and famous pastor. The church, located in Center City Philadelphia was renamed Tindley Temple in honor of the Rev. Dr. Charles A. Tindley.

The version of "Stand By Me" (#644) that we will sing was written by Tom Kendzia. It utilizes many of the intercessions and images contained in Charles Tindley's original lyrics. Its central message remains rooted in the Mark's gospel: to have faith that the Lord is always with us.

Did you know that reading music is not as hard as you think? Simply follow the direction of the note. I like to call this "The Upsy/Downsy method." If the note is placed higher on the staff (the five horizontal lines) it will be placed higher in your voice.

Be ready for the sung commons of the mass. Turn to the Index for Mass Settings and Service Music. (#952) Just below the bold print you will find the Mass of Creation which we are currently singing and the numbers for the Glory to God, Holy, When We Eat This Bread, Amen and Lamb of God.

During Lent and Easter we will be singing the Mass of Christ the Savior by Dan Schutte.
