We are trying to keep class sizes smaller so that our students and volunteer catechists and aides can have a better classroom experience, but we can only do so if we know who will be in our program.

From Our Catechists - What was one of your greatest joys in teaching this year?

♪ Liturgical Notes ♪

Today we celebrate the 11th Sunday of Ordinary time. In the context of the liturgical year, ordinary refers to "numbered." While today is not a special Solemnity like Pentecost, Trinity and Corpus Christi, it remains important because it is Sunday – The Lord's Day. In terms of music, today presents a good opportunity to switch to a different mass setting as it begins a series of Sundays in Ordinary Time that take us through the summer and fall months.

A mass setting is a musical composition for the prayers that are common to (or the same at) each mass. (ex. The Gloria or Amen) The opposite of commons are the proper prayers which are written specifically for each day's liturgy. (The propers begin with "Let us pray" and end with "Through Christ our Lord. Amen.") For centuries composers have written musical settings consisting of all the mass parts. The first such was the Messe de Nostre Dame, written by Guillaume de Machaut in the mid 14th century.

If you turn to #952 in the hymnal you will find some of the masses that we have sung including, most recently the Mass of Christ the Savior. Today we will begin singing The Mass of Renewal. The parts that we will sing can be found at the following numbers:

871	Glory to God
872	Alleluia
874	Holy
876	When We Eat This Bread
878	Amen
879	Lamb of God

To be honest, I will miss singing this mass as of Christ the Savior as you have been singing it so well. I trust, however that you will do the same with our new mass setting.
