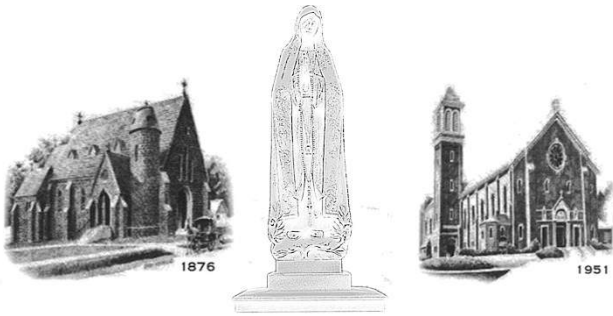

What is the Monthly Archdiocesan Assessment?

Each Parish is charged an annual “assessment” by the Archdiocese of Newark, which is payable on a monthly basis. The annual assessment is a calculated amount, based on St. Mary’s ordinary revenue reported on its most recent Financial Report.

Ordinary revenue is composed of Sunday and Holyday collections, Christmas and Easter collections, Rental Income and such.

Why does the Archdiocese charge each Parish an assessment? All Parishes share the responsibility for providing funds to manage the Archdiocesan offices and agencies, and to provide educational, charitable, and social services. In addition, the Archdiocese provides a number of administrative services that each Parish uses in its daily operations: legal, financial, banking, personnel, property management, to name a few. The assessment paid by each Parish helps the Archdiocese fund these and many other services provided.

The assessment expense paid by a Parish is one its larger operating expenses. The current year assessment obligation for St. Mary’s Church is \$117,940. In an effort to help each Parish meet its assessment obligation, the Archdiocese grants permission for a Parish to take up a monthly “Assessment” collection. The Parish does not have to include this collection in its ordinary revenue, so it does not get included when the annual assessment is calculated. Think of it as “tax-free” income for the Parish. This gives the Parish more money for the rest of its operating budget.

We hope this explanation will encourage you to be more generous with our Monthly Archdiocesan Assessment collection (the second collection on the first weekend of every month). It is a great help to our annual budget.

Family Mass Music Ministry

The Family Mass features non-traditional, guitar-driven music. The Family Mass choir was begun as a children’s choir (which was lost in the transition from Msgr. Walsh Hall to the Main Church) and would like to incorporate more voices in the weekly music. Those of any age are welcome to sing with the choir during the Family Mass. Those who favor an instrumental rather than vocal approach are also welcome! If you play the guitar, drums, violin, cello, flute, or any other instrument you are welcome to find out more about the music and how you can join and give the gift of music to your fellow Parishioners!

At first glance, today's readings seem simple. The gospel (found on pg. 223 of the hymnal) speaks of the Golden Rule. The bigger challenge, however, comes from the book of Exodus (pg. 222.) We are challenged to expand this rule to include being just to the most vulnerable around us.

You will find today's music to be especially full of the call to love and justice. Our first prelude; "The Eyes and Hands of Christ" (#545) utilizes the beautiful image from St. Theresa of Avila. Our second prelude "They'll Know We Are Christians" (#584) speaks of love as the distinguishing characteristic of a follower of Christ. For me, this song also harkens back to a time of great hope. Playing it is my prayer for mission of today's church.

A special welcome to the youth who will be receiving the Holy Spirit in confirmation this year and their families. Several weeks ago I heard an interview on NPR where an author spoke of today's youth as being "intensely interested" in religion and having "very good questions." He also spoke of their problems with religious people who had "a sense of inertia" and were "just hanging on." My hope is that our young people will pray and live to the calling of the third verse of "The Eyes and Hands of Christ (#545) "Not what we are, but what we become. Not what we say, but what we do. Living the challenge as bearers of light. We are the eyes and hands of Christ.
