What is the Monthly Archdiocesan Assessment?

Each Parish is charged an annual "assessment" by the Archdiocese of Newark, which is payable on a monthly basis. The annual assessment is a calculated amount, based on St. Mary's ordinary revenue reported on its most recent Financial Report. Ordinary revenue is composed of Sunday and Holyday collections, Christmas and Easter collections, Rental Income and such.

Why does the Archdiocese charge each Parish an assessment? All Parishes share the responsibility for providing funds to manage the Archdiocesan offices and agencies, and to provide educational, charitable, and social services. In addition, the Archdiocese provides a number of administrative services that each Parish uses in its daily operations: legal, financial, banking, personnel, property management, to name a few. The assessment paid by each Parish helps the Archdiocese fund these and many other services provided.

The assessment expense paid by a Parish is one its larger operating expenses. The current year assessment obligation for St. Mary's Church is \$117,940. In an effort to help each Parish meet its assessment obligation, the Archdiocese grants permission for a Parish to take up a monthly "Assessment" collection. The Parish does not have to include this collection in its ordinary revenue, so it does not get included when the annual assessment is calculated. Think of it as "tax-free" income for the Parish. This gives the Parish more money for the rest of its operating budget.

We hope this explanation will encourage you to be more generous with our Monthly Archdiocesan Assessment collection (the second collection on the first weekend of every month). It is a great help to our annual budget.

Because today's Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) falls on Sunday, it replaces the 31st Sunday in ordinary time. As you look at the readings (beginning on 226) do not skip the entrance antiphon which provides insight into the nature of what we commemorate today.



On Thursday of this week, we will have a special liturgy honoring those who have died this past year. This liturgy will have a similar tone to All Souls but will have a more specific focus; those who have had funerals at St. Mary's as well as those you have asked us to specifically to remember.

Between these two liturgies you will hear some music with which you may be familiar. You will also have an opportunity to hear some lesser known musical selections.

On the weekend we will sing “Parable” (#689.) This song draws on a text from a popular funeral reading taken from the Book of Ecclesiastes. You will also hear an alternate setting of “I Know That My Redeemer Lives” by Scott Soper. (#690)

The adult choir will be singing two beautiful anthems: “If God Is For Us” by Grayson Warren Brown and “In Memoriam” by Susan Naus Dengler and Lee Dengler. The former is in a rousing gospel style and the latter incorporates themes by Schubert, Dvorak's and Taps.

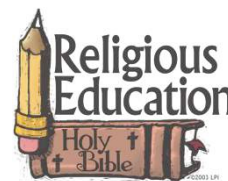
On Thursday you will hear “Shelter Me O God.” (#465) The second verse of this psalm depicts God as a mother gathering her young. This song is a beautiful way to honor a deceased mother or loved one who has nurtured others. The song that touches me the most is Thursday evening's closing hymn; “Go In Peace.” (#682) I was introduced to this piece by a priest friend who selected it as the closing hymn for his own father's funeral. The word which best describes this song would be “lullaby.”
