From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings from Rome,

I have been here for three days now and what a workout they have been giving us. Between the tours and orientation we must have covered at least seven miles. All, of course, up hill since Rome is built on seven hills. I have offered your intentions at all my Masses so far, especially during our opening Mass at the crypt of Saint Peter.

I would like to continue our Year of Faith catechesis on the Creed, especially since our Holy Father Pope Benedict has made this the focus of his weekly audiences here in Rome. Let's begin with "I Believe (Credo); it is a statement of certitude and affirmation that we believe, profess and affirm all that follows that one phrase. It is not just a community professing their faith, but more importantly each individual, "I", proclaiming it for themselves. They are stating this is who I am and what I believe for the salvation of my soul. They are not just mere words to be repeated, but each one of them has meaning. Let us listen to **Benedict's words** from his weekly audience of January 23rd:

"I believe in God"

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our catechesis for this Year of Faith, we now turn to the Creed, the solemn profession of our faith as Christians. At the beginning of the Creed, we say, "I believe in God." Faith is our response to the God who first speaks to us, makes Himself known and calls us to enter into communion with Him. We hear God speaking to us in the Scriptures, which recount the history of His revelation, culminating in the coming of His Son, Jesus Christ. A central figure in this history of revelation is Abraham, the father and model of all believers (cf. Rom 4:11-12). Sustained by God's blessing and trusting in His promises, Abraham set off into the unknown. Like Abraham, we too are called to let faith shape our thoughts and actions in accordance with God's saving word, even when this runs contrary to the thinking and ways of this world. With the eyes of faith, we discern God's presence and His promise of eternal life beyond the realities of this present existence. In opening ourselves to God's blessing, we become in turn a blessing for others.

May we fully comprehend the words we speak and more fully proclaim our lives as Catholics and Christians to the Glory of God the Father. Amen

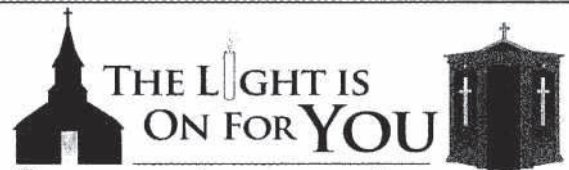

Ask Congress to Protect Your Tax Deduction for Charitable Giving

The Catholic Bishops of New Jersey are asking parishioners to help preserve Tax Deductions for Charitable Giving by contacting their members of Congress. The tax deduction for charitable contributions is important for our parishes, Catholic Charities and all non-profit organizations.

For almost 100 years the federal income tax code has allowed tax deductions for contributions to charities. This tax policy has successfully encouraged charitable giving, especially during times of economic recovery and when charitable resources are under great stress.

Currently, Congress is considering proposals that would eliminate, reduce or cap tax deductions for charitable donations. Any negative action against tax deductions for charitable giving would significantly hurt the ability of Catholic Charities and other non-profit organizations to serve the most vulnerable in our society.

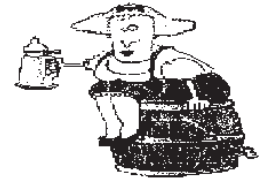

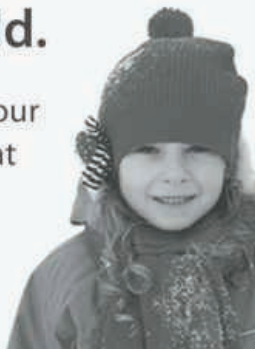
