From the Pastor's Desk

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This is most likely the last column that I will write for the pastor's desk before I depart for Rome. I leave on January 26th. All other columns will be written while I am at the North American College in Rome.

I would like to continue our topics on the Year of Faith with a brief discussion on Saints, particularly Elizabeth Ann Seton. The United States Conference of Bishops picked a number of Saints to be discussed during this Year of Faith. They appropriately picked Elizabeth Ann Seton since she is the first daughter of America to receive such honors. Let's first discuss what a Saint is. As we know, basically a Saint is someone who has attained the Glory of Heaven by living a virtuous life. If I may, I would like to quote Pope Paul the VI from his homily during the canonization of Elizabeth Ann Seton.

"But what do we mean when we say: «She is a Saint»? We all have some idea of the meaning of this highest title; but it is still difficult for us to make an exact analysis of it. Being a Saint means being perfect, with a perfection that attains the highest level that a human being can reach. A Saint is a human creature fully conformed to the will of God. A Saint is a person in whom all sin-the principle of death-is cancelled out and replaced by the living splendor of divine grace. The analysis of the concept of sanctity brings us to recognize in a soul the mingling of two elements that are entirely different but which come together to produce a single effect: sanctity. One of these elements is the human and moral element, raised to the degree of heroism: heroic virtues are always required by the Church for the recognition of a person's sanctity. The second element is the mystical element, which express the measure and form of divine action in the person chosen by God to realize in herself-always in an original way-the image of Christ" (Cfr. Rom. 8, 29).

In her life, Elizabeth exhibited these Virtues of Sanctity. She is the founder of the Sisters of Charity of Saint Joseph. Here is a brief description of her from the USCCB website:

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was the charming "belle of the ball" as a young woman in New York City, linked to all the first families. At the age of 19, she fell in love and married the wealthy, handsome William Magee Seton. The two had a very happy marriage, raising five children. Ten years after they were married, William's business and health both failed, and Elizabeth was left a poor widow with five children to raise alone. Her love for the Eucharist led her to convert to Catholicism and founded the first order of religious women in America, the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, a religious community based on the Rule of St. Vincent De Paul. She was able to still raise her children, as well as live the life of a sister and found several schools. She became the cofounder of the first free Catholic School in America.

As you can see, Elizabeth was human like us. She was not born a Saint, but became one. She totally committed herself to God. None of us are born Saints, nor do we need to be professed religious like Saint Elizabeth. We just need to perfect our human nature. We are all capable of heroic virtues and can attain the Glory of Heaven.

Make a Gift through an IRA Charitable Rollover

The IRA Charitable Rollover has been extended through 2012 and 2013. This extension allows individuals 70½ or older to move up to \$100,000 from their IRAs directly to qualified charities such as your parish, Archbishop's Annual Appeal, the Archdiocese of Newark, or another archdiocesan institution without having to pay income taxes on the donated money. However, you will need to act fast to take advantage of the 2012 tax year. Qualified distributions made by February 1, 2013, may be counted retroactively for the 2012 tax year. Also, if you took a distribution from an IRA in December 2012, you may make a contribution to a qualified charity before February 1, 2013 and treat this as a direct transfer. A Good Reason to Use Church Envelopes

As the new year begins, just a reminder that with the Internal Revenue Service Pension Act of 2006, the charitable contribution deduction is disallowed for any monetary contributions (cash, check, etc.) unless you, the giver, maintain a record of the contribution. The record of the donation must be in the form of a bank record, cancelled check, or a written communication from the recipient showing the name of the charitable organization, the date of the contribution and the amount of the contribution. When using our church collection envelopes you will receive a tax statement with your yearly total. If you do not receive monthly envelopes at this time but wish to, please call the Parish Center at 973-235-1100.
