

FATHER TRINIDAD JOSÉ CUEVAS

As he contemplates his path to the priesthood, Father Trinidad José Cuevas is confident that “everything will be in the hands of the saints” adding that his hope and aspiration is to become “a holy priest for the salvation of souls.”

Fr. Cuevas, 33, is the eldest of 18 brothers and sisters all of whom were born in Southern California. His parents immigrated from Jalisco, Mexico, more than 35 years ago. Fr. Cuevas says that such a large family is “the biggest sign of God’s love” for him and that he is “indebted with gratitude” for his parents’ “openness to life.”

He is especially grateful for the fostering of his vocation by Our Lady, “the most loving of Mothers” and the one to whom he has entrusted his celibacy. His “hero” is Saint Joseph. The new priest also prays for the intercession of Blessed John Paul II and to Saint Faustina Kowalski, both of whom remind him “every day of the Lord’s great mercy for souls.” Also influential has been Saint Francis Cabrini, patron saint of Redemptoris Mater Seminary. His mentors have been his catechists in the Neocatechumenal Way “who have guided me and continue to guide me in my itinerary of Christian formation.” Equally important has been his own community in the Neocatechumenal Way where his vocation “was born and continues to be nourished.”

Fr. Cuevas entered the seminary when he was 21 but initially never thought of doing so. He had planned to become a history professor and to get married and have many children like his parents. Following a time of “deep crisis and many questions about life,” he eventually realized that “the answer was to simply trust in the Lord.”

Reflecting on seminary life, Fr. Cuevas describes it as “being on a 24/7 spiritual workout.” The seminary, he continues, is an “oasis where one is nourished and refreshed by the Lord.” It was at Redemptoris Mater where he has felt “the most loved by God.” He is especially grateful for the Rector, Rev. Msgr. Renato Grasselli, spiritual director Father Robert Santamaria and all the priests at the Seminary.

In addition to schooling in his home state, Fr. Cuevas attended Seton Hall University. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Education and a Master of Arts in Systematic Theology.

Within the Archdiocese of Newark, Fr. Cuevas’ field education and summers were spent at Saint Mary Parish, Plainfield; Saint Anthony of Padua Parish, Union City; Saint Columbia Parish, Newark; Hackensack University Medical Center, and Saint Michael’s Medical Center. He was a deacon at Saint Benedict Parish, Newark.

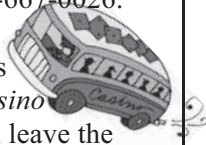
Family Mass Schedule
