"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends". John 15:13

The above quote from John's Gospel is significant for three important events this weekend; Memorial day, the ordination of 16 new priests for the Archdiocese of Newark and Pentecost Sunday (the birthday of the Church). On Memorial Day, we remember all those who gave their lives for our freedoms. On his day of ordination the priest gives up a secular life in order to serve the people of God, and Christ gave up His life so the we can have life, and sent us the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

This weekend, we celebrate Memorial Day. This tradition began in 1865 with the practice of decorating the graves of soldiers (thus it was known as Decoration Day). In May of 1866, Gen. John A. Logan was likely a significant factor in how this became so wide-spread a holiday, when in his position as Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, he issued a proclamation that Decoration Day should be observed nationwide. For the first time it was officially celebrated on May 30th of that same year. This day was chosen because it was not the anniversary of any battle. The name gradually changed from Decoration Day to Memorial Day.

The holiday recalls the lives of so many who willingly gave their lives for who we are today. This we must never forget. In an article in *First Things* in 2010 **Alessia Pirolo** profiles his father, **Marlowe Fletcher**, an Air Force veteran of the Vietnam War, who visits his son's resting place every week and also attends the funeral of every New York City and Long Island soldier killed in the Middle East. His leather jacket has a depiction of an eagle on it, surrounded by the words, "The nation which forgets its heroes will itself be forgotten." Memorial Day reminds us not to forget those who have sacrificed their lives for us. Their lives were not given in vain. In light of that and the Gospel quote we have so many friends that we have never met.

Also this weekened 16 new priests are being ordained for service to the people of God in the Archdiocese of Newark as is the tradition here in the Archdiocese. This always takes place on Memorial Day weekend. His Grace Archbishop Myers will be assigning one of the newly ordained to Saint Mary's Parish. Yes, that means one of our priest's will be leaving. Fr. Mike will be reassigned by the Archbishop to make room for the new priest coming to Saint Mary's. I am sure Fr. Mike will be missed by many, as he has made his own impact on Saint Mary's Church. Let us keep Fr. Mike and all priests in our prayers. We are blessed that the Archbishop has confidence in the people of Saint Mary's to send us a newly ordained.

Finally we as a Church celebrate Pentecost Sunday, which we proclaim as the Birthday of the Church. Pentecost Sunday is one of the most ancient feasts of the Church, celebrated early enough to be mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles (20:16) and St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians (16:8). It supplants the Jewish feast of Pentecost, which took place 50 days after the Passover and which celebrated the sealing of the Old Covenant on Mount Sinai. Christ who fulfilled and sealed the new covenant by his sacrifice on the cross and 50 days after Easter sent the Holy Spirit to descend upon the Apostles to be with us always.

My brothers and sisters as we have so much in our lives to be thankful for, let us not forget those less fortunate who struggle each day to find meaning in their lives. May the Holy Spirit bless and console them.


