## From the Pastor's Desk

Among prominent writers who died in 2009 ...

■ **Christopher Hibbert**, successful author of lively narrative histories on a wide range of subjects.

■ **W. D. Snodgrass**, a poet of interior reflection who knew that "Nothing like any of us / will be seen again, forever."

■ **John Mortimer**, British barrister and mystery writer who created defense lawyer Horace Rumpole and his formidable wife, usually called She Who Must Be Obeyed. Of his own approaching death he wrote: "Dying is a matter of slapstick and pratfalls. The aging process is not gradual or gentle. It rushes up, pushes you over and runs off laughing. No one should grow old who isn't ready to appear ridiculous."

■ **John Updike**, eminent novelist, best known for his novels about middle-class American Harry "Rabbit" Angstrom.

■ **Christopher Nolan**, Irish writer of fiction, poetry and memoir. Born mute and paraplegic, he learned to write with what he called his "unicorn stick," a rod attached to his forehead, which he used to type. He wrote: "My mind is like a spin-dryer at full speed, my thoughts fly around my skull while millions of beautiful words cascade down in my lap. Images gunfire across my consciousness and while trying to discipline them I jump in awe at the soul-filled bounty of my mind's expanse."

■ **Horton Foote**, playwright (*The Trip to Bountiful*) and screenwriter ("To Kill a Mockingbird.") He once said: "I believe very deeply in the human spirit and I have a sense of awe about it because I don't know how people carry on. I've known people that the world has thrown everything at to discourage them, to kill them, to break their spirit. And yet something about them retains a dignity. They face life and they don't ask quarters."

■ **Eleanor Perenyi**, who wrote eloquently about gardening.

■ **Frank McCourt**, NY native who wrote the best-seller *Angela's Ashes* (1996), about his Limerick boyhood as the son of an alcoholic father (who deserted the family) and a mother who called the family's typical dinner of bread and tea a balanced meal, since it consisted of a solid and a liquid. At times he had to steal bread and milk so his family could eat. He left school at 13, but, after returning to the US, graduated from NYU and became a NYC high-school teacher, as he described in *Tis* (1999) and *Teacher Man* (2005). He said of *Angela's Ashes* that "When the book was published in Ireland, I was denounced from hill, pulpit and barstool." But Limerick University later gave him an honorary doctorate, and there are now *Angela's Ashes* tours of the city. Reflecting on his experiences, McCourt said, "I learned the significance of my insignificant life."

■ **Leszek Kolakowski**, Polish philosopher who renounced Communism and became a key inspiration for the Solidarity movement that restored Polish independence. Philosophy's role, he said, is "never to let the inquisitive energy of mind go to sleep, never to stop questioning what appears to be obvious and definitive, always to defy the seemingly intact resources of common sense," and "never to forget that there are questions that lie beyond the legitimate horizon of science and are nevertheless crucially important to the survival of humanity as we know it."

■ **Lionel Casson**, NYU professor of classical history, whose fascinating and gracefully written books include *Travel in the Ancient World* and *Libraries in the Ancient World*.

■ **Budd Schulberg**, screenwriter for “On the Waterfront.” An ex-Communist, he denounced 8 former party members at the 1951 House Committee on Un-American Activities hearings.

Deaths of those prominent in media included:

■ **Paul Harvey**, long-time radio newscaster with a down-to-earth style, a Midwest twang, and an enormous audience.

■ **Walter Cronkite**, long America’s most famous TV news anchorman, with CBS. His friend Mike Ashford had a memorable compliment: “I was often asked, ‘What he’s really like?’ And I would always answer, ‘He is just the way you hope he is.’” I liked him best for “You Are There,” a TV show from his younger days in which he covered famous historical events as though he were a TV reporter on the scene.

■ **Irving Kristol**, editor and publisher of the influential journal *Commentary*. George Will said Kristol “discovered and mentored younger writers who were receptive to his belief that the purpose of the social sciences is not to tell us what government should do but rather to tell us what government is doing that is not working, which always is a lot.”

■ **Robert Novak**, columnist and TV commentator called “The Prince of Darkness,” who became a Catholic in 1998.

■ **William Safire**, speechwriter for President Richard Nixon and Pulitzer Prize-winning New York *Times* columnist.

The business world lost ...

■ **Adolf Merckle**, German owner of Ratiopharm, one of the world’s largest generic pharmaceutical companies, worth \$9.2 billion. After losing hundreds of millions of dollars speculating in Volkswagen stock and falling under pressure from banks to sell his business, he took his own life.

■ **Oscar Mayer**, whose namesake hot-dog company is now part of Philip Morris. My brother-in-law recently saw the Oscar Mayer promotional truck, which is shaped like a hot-dog, in Fort Lee. Maybe some of you remember their classic jingle: “I wish I were an Oscar Mayer wiener. That is what I really want to be. ‘Cause if I were an Oscar Mayer wiener, everyone would be in love with me.”

■ **John S. Barry**, marketing genius who promoted WD-40 as the product with more than 2,000 uses. Its name was shorthand for “water displacement, formulation successful in 40<sup>th</sup> attempt,” and it was developed to help protect Atlas missiles. An Asian bus driver once found it effective in removing a python from his vehicle’s undercarriage.

■ **Sy Syms**, founder of 52 clothing stores. After working in his family’s NYC store 9 years, he opened a rival business around the corner. He more than made up for the sorry grammar of one of his early TV commercials (“At Syms, you, the educated consumer, is our best customer”) by being on the board of the NY Archdiocese’s effort to help Catholic schools.

### Right to Life Bus Trip

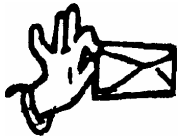

### A Good Reason to Use Church Envelopes

As the new year begins, just a reminder that with the Internal Revenue Service Pension Act of 2006, the charitable contribution deduction is disallowed for any monetary contributions (cash, check, etc.) unless you, the giver, maintain a record of the contribution. The record of the donation must be in the form of a bank record, cancelled check, or a written communication from the recipient showing the name of the charitable organization, the date of the contribution and the amount of the contribution. When using our church collection envelopes you will receive a tax statement with your yearly total. If you do not receive monthly envelopes at this time but wish to, please call the Parish Center at 973-235-1100.
