From the Pastor's Desk

In 2009 politics lost ...

■ **John Marchi**, gentlemanly NY State Senator and a fine Catholic. After beating John Lindsey for the 1969 NYC Republican mayoralty nomination, he lost to Lindsey, who ran as a Liberal, in the general election. Four years later, Marchi again lost the mayor's race, to Democrat Abraham Beame.

■ **Jack Kemp**, ex-Buffalo Bills quarterback who became President George H.W. Bush's Secretary for Housing and Urban Development, gaining bipartisan respect for his concern for social justice and inner-city needs. He lost the Republican Presidential nomination to Senator Bob Dole, then became his running mate. While the two were competing in 1985, Kemp poked fun at Dole by saying that "In a recent fire, Bob Dole's library burned down. Both books were lost. And he hadn't even finished coloring one of them."

■ **Omar Bongo**, for 42 years strongman ruler of Gabon, a poor country of 1.5 million. Benefiting from a booming oil business, he accumulated 39 expensive properties, 9 luxury cars and 70 bank accounts

■ **Corazon (Cory) Aquino**, devout Catholic whose election as President of the Philippines (1986-1992), after her husband Benigno was assassinated, ended the 20-year dictatorship of Ferdinand Marcos. Her trials in office (insurgencies, 7 attempted coups, typhoons, floods, draughts and a volcano eruption) led her to be nicknamed "Calamity Cory."

■ **Sen. Edward ("Ted") Kennedy**. Although his presidential hopes did not survive a 1969 scandal in which Mary Jo Kopechne drowned in his car after he drove it off the bridge at Chappaquiddick, he became perhaps the most important Senator in American history, serving until his death from brain cancer. He could be blatantly partisan, as when, in 1987, he led attacks on Supreme-Court nominee Robert Bork that even some liberal commentators called demagogic. (He accused Bork of opening the door to back-alley abortions and segregated lunch counters for blacks.) But Kennedy was also praised for his devotion to the causes he favored and for his willingness to be bi-partisan. He leaned on his Catholic faith increasingly after the death of his mother and during his final illness, attending Mass regularly.

■ **John V. Kelly**, longtime Nutley Commissioner and former Mayor who also made a large impact as a NJ Assemblyman. As a WW II veteran, a banker, an involved citizen, a mover in charitable works and an outstanding Catholic family man, his influence will long live on in Nutley. John Kelly was also one of St. Mary's two lay trustees from 1973 until his death. He has been named to Nutley's Hall of Fame.

Deaths in the world of sports included ...

■ **Rob Gauntlett**, 21, British sportsman, who fell to his death from the notoriously dangerous eastern ascent of Mt. Tacul (13,973'), in the French Alps. At 19, he became the youngest Briton to climb Everest. In 2008 he and his friend James Hopper were honored as the National Geographic Society's adventurers of the year for journeying 26,000 miles, from the North to the South Pole, using no motorized transport. "We've tried to really kind of show that the impossible is nothing; you can actually achieve whatever you want," as Gauntlett put it.

■ **Dante Laveli**, Hall of Fame receiver and favorite target of quarterback Otto Graham on the great Cleveland Browns teams of the 1940s and '50s, which won seven titles under coach Paul Brown. He was also an infantryman in World War II's Battle of the Bulge.

■ **George McAfee**, Chicago Bears' running back, defensive back, punter and punt returner, who still holds the NFL record for punt returns (averaging 12.78 yards). Red Grange called him "the most dangerous man with the football in the game." Service in World War II cost him four years of playing time.

■ **George Kell**, Detroit Tiger who edged out Ted Williams for the 1949 batting title by less than a percentage point. Kell won the right way. In the 9th inning of the season's final game, with Kell on deck, the Cleveland Indians brought in pitching immortal Bob Feller as a reliever. Kell refused his manager's offer to ensure him the crown by pinch hitting for him. The game's last out occurred before Kell went to the plate.

■ **Lloyd Ruby**, who was in a commanding position to win the Indy 500 five times between 1966-1971, but never did, because of mechanical breakdowns and similar misfortunes. (One time, a crewman left a gas hose in his car as he sped off.)

■ **John Oros**, a leading jockey at Chicago area tracks in 1939, when he was just 17. Explaining his success, he said: "There ain't any mystery about me or my riding. I don't use no special tricks. I don't whisper no sweet words in the horse's ear. I just sit up there and hang on."

■ **Felix ("Doc") Blanchard**, running back on Army's undefeated teams of 1944-1945: "Mr. Inside," who teamed with Glenn Davis ("Mr. Outside")—both of them Heisman trophy winners. Blanchard flew 84 combat missions over North Vietnam for the Air Force, retiring as a Colonel.

■ **Jack Lohrke**, 1940/50s infielder with the NY Giants and the Phils, nicknamed "Lucky Lohrke" for the ways he escaped death. In World War II, four soldiers were killed next to him, two on either side. In 1945 he was bumped from a California-bound military plane by an officer who outranked him. The plane crashed, killing all aboard. In 1946, heading to an away game with the minor league Spokane Indians, he got word that he'd been promoted to a triple-A team, and left the lunch stop to hitch-hike to his new assignment. The Spokane bus plunged into a valley, killing nine.

■ **Joe Bowman**, sharpshooter who coached entertainment personalities and FBI agents. James Drury, star of the 1960s TV western "The Virginian," said "He could hit an Anacin tablet with a .22 rifle at 30 yards and pulverize it every time. ... In one five-thousandth of a second he could get off three shots and put them in the middle of a 50-cent piece at 30 paces. That's about as good as you can get."

■ **Captain Lou Albano**, pro wrestling villain with The Sicilians, who later managed The Wild Samoans, The Executioners and The Moondogs. He also played Cyndi Lauper's father in a famous music video. In real life he was happily married to his wife Geri. "I've been married to the same woman for 32 years, and I've got four wonderful grown kids. Cyndi and I are also lifetime honorary chairpersons for multiple sclerosis, and when I started doing this charity work, people said, 'Hey, fat guy, you're not so bad after all.'"
