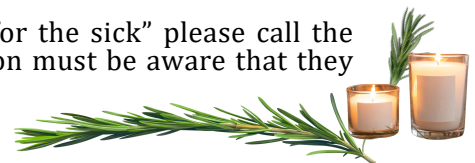

Addressing Our Parish Deficit

As part of our commitment to transparency, we share this update with gratitude and hope:

After 9 months, we are currently operating with a **\$78,710 deficit** (expenses over income) largely due to unexpected costs. A severe winter brought higher utility and insurance bills, along with major unplanned expenses: boiler and water heater repairs, \$25,000 in snow removal and salt, and damage to our roof and facilities.

We have also experienced a 10% decline in collections, and we mourn the loss of three generous parishioners whose support helped sustain our parish for many years.

And yet, we are deeply grateful.

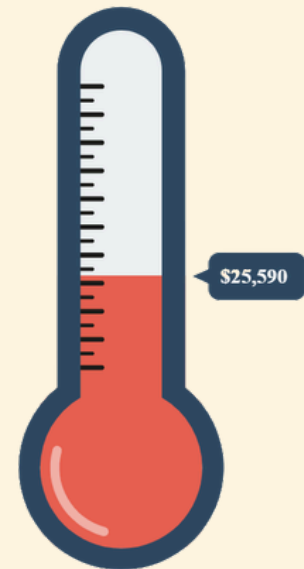
Because of your continued generosity, St. Mary's remains a vibrant place of worship, community, and tradition. Thank you for all you have done—and continue to do—to support our parish.

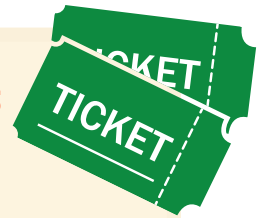

St. Anthony of Padua ***June 13th***



- Priest and Doctor
- 1195 - June 13, 1231
- Portugal, Italy
- Canonized 1232
- Patron of lost articles, childless women, the poor, harvests, travelers, horses and donkeys, Portugal

St. Anthony of Padua was born in 1195 in Lisbon, Portugal. A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, he, like ourselves, wanted to live for something beyond himself that would give meaning to his own life. He was about 20 years old when he joined the Augustinians at a monastery near his native city.

Anthony often helped followers of Francis when they came begging for alms. He was inspired by the martyrdom of five Franciscan friars in Morocco and became consumed with the desire to join the Franciscans and preach the Gospel to the Muslims. In 1220 he became a Franciscan and sailed for Morocco – but upon reaching his destination fell seriously ill and was bedridden for several months.

En route back to Portugal, Anthony's ship encountered a storm and was washed up on the shores of Sicily, where Franciscan friars nursed Anthony to good health. He then journeyed north to Assisi for a general gathering of some 3,000 Franciscans.

In 1221, Anthony embarked on his career as a Franciscan preacher, proclaiming the Gospel through France and Italy, where large crowds filled town squares and vast fields to hear his sermons.

Anthony called people to a deeper faith because he himself was a man of faith. He never lost sight of the transcendent dimension of his own life which enabled others to see in him the transcendent dimension of their lives. He was truly a living Gospel to others – denouncing injustice and proclaiming the message of love for God and all his creatures.

That is what made Anthony a Wonder-Worker, a friend to all of us. It is in this spirit, and with this vision, that St. Anthony Shrine, founded in 1947, tries to operate.

The Franciscan Friars, in the spirit of St. Francis and St. Anthony, continue our tradition of helping the needy, physically as well as spiritually, and strive to be instruments of peace to all people.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

First Reading: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

The Lord appears to Moses on Mount Sinai and proclaims to him that he Lord is a “merciful God...slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.”

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Paul exhorts the Corinthians to live in peace and harmony, and for the first time, invokes the Blessed Trinity.

Gospel: John 3:16-18

In this beautiful passage, Jesus tells Nicodemus that God loved his people so much that he “gave his only son.” Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that anyone who believes in him will not die but will enjoy life with him for all eternity.

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

Moses reminds the Israelites that when they were starving in the desert, the Lord fed them with “manna” -- a food not known to them.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Paul points out to the Corinthians that through the sharing of the cup and the breaking of the bread, they are all one in Christ Jesus.

Gospel: John 6:51-58

After Jesus feeds the five thousand people with barley loaves and fishes, he tries to make them understand the significance and the meaning of what he has done. He tells them, in mysterious and beautiful words, that the bread he gives is his flesh and says, “I myself am the living bread... If anyone eats this bread, he shall live forever.”

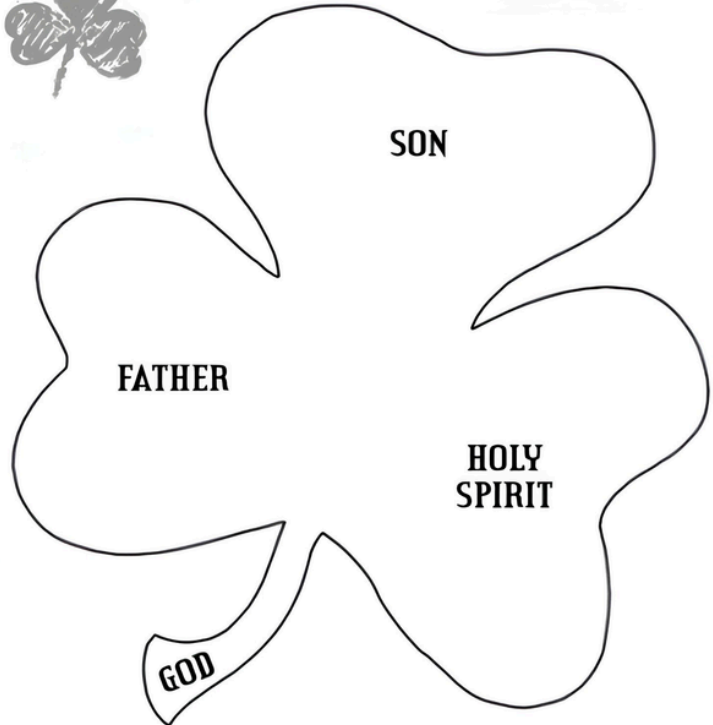
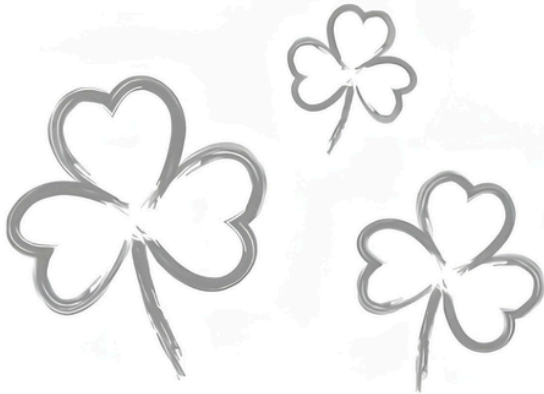
THE MOST HOLY TRINITY
